



Author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. The six-session DVD features Dr. Amy-Jill Levine offering a fresh, timely reinterpretation of the Passion of Jesus. The video segments are approximately 10-12 minutes each and, when combined with the six book chapters, make an ideal six-week group study. All video sessions are

closed captioned.

The six sessions include: Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem, The Temple Incident, The Anointing of Jesus and the Role of Women, Jesus' Teachings in the Temple, The Last Supper Traditions, Gethsemane. Amy-Jill Levine describes herself as an unorthodox member of an Orthodox synagogue and a Yankee Jewish feminist who until 2021 taught New Testament in a Christian divinity school in the buckle of the Bible Belt. Those interested in participating may sign up at the Connection Point. Classes run for six weeks beginning March 27 (no meeting on May 1). 






FPC is excited announce the 4th annual CALL TO ARTISTS

The Worship and Work of the First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, MI Minutes of the March 24th, 2025 Regular Session Meeting The meeting was held at the Church, 405 N-M37 Highway, Hastings MI in the Adult classroom.

In attendance were Elders Sunny Andersen, Gary Kimble, Kim Bosma, Carl Lickley, Sandra Billingsley, Debbie Rang, Cindy Preston, Celeste Wolverton, John Johnston, Dan Carpenter and Moderator Rev. Nick Marlatt. Excused: Elders Linda McGuire and Steve Laubaugh.

A quorum was established and Pastor Nick opened the meeting with prayer at 7:00 followed by a reading from Isiah 61 and discussion about that reading. The minutes from the February meeting and tonight's Agenda were approved.

Clerk's Report- Correspondence from Presbytery reminding us of the One Great Hour of sharing and thanking us for our Dec contributions was circulated.

Pastor's Report- We're in the midst of Lent and Messy Church is coming up on Sunday. We will create a congregational Art Project based on the prodigal son. We will have the interfaith Chaplain from GVSU as our guest pastor the first Sunday of April while Nick is on spring break.

Personnel Report- Carl Lickley- The Nursery Attendant position is underway, we are waiting on the work permit, then we will get the MOU in place. The staff review process has been finalized. Carl described the process to Session, and the new Michigan's Earned Sick Time Act. Each staff member must accrue Sick time based on 1 hour per every 30 hours worked. There was discussion on how this will be tracked.

Trustees –Dan Carpenter-The boiler will be replaced the week of April 12th (Spring break) the water will have to be turned off for a few hours while that work is being done. Updated estimate on the security systems it has gone up to 61,670 Dan is working with Hickey Electric to get that down to the \$58,000 that can be covered by the grant. Also floor bolts and mirrored film will be placed on the exterior NAPS doors so there cannot be a visual from outside of where the children would go for their safe space in an emergency. The water fountain by NAPs will be replaced. The other one will need a sign saying it is unfiltered and therefore unsafe for preschoolers. We are going to have our flat roof membrane inspected; we are starting to lose pieces due to the winds etc. so far it is not leaking. Also 2 parking light bulbs were replaced. Looking at solar lights to light the NAPS sign outside. To have an electric light installed the quote was \$1300. Alternates are being looked at. The Barry Roubaix camping was discussed. Nick will be the "camp host" we are not charging, but will accept a free will donation. The race director will add our 30 spaces to the race website. A port a john will be placed for the campers to use. A motion was made to allow this, it was supported and passed.

Worship and Music –Kim Bosma- Easter is coming up, there will be an egg hunt and Brunch at 9:00 before church. Staff is getting ads ready to go in the paper. Kim is getting more information regarding the hard drive in the tech booth.

NAPS- Sunny- 50 students are enrolled for next year. No action items.

Worship & Work of the Session

Family Ministries- Celeste Wolverton– Thigs are going well with PATH. Candy is being collected for the Easter Egg Hunt. May 18 is an old fashioned church picnic. It will not be a potluck. This is also Graduation Sunday and the NAPS teachers and Sunday school volunteers will be honored. May is a busy Month with Mother's day, the family picnic, and then Memorial Day. VBS is being planned for June 10, 11, and 12th. Women's bible study will start back up in September. Rally Sunday kickoff will include forming a new CARE group opportunity as well.

Deacons/Mission –No action items.

Stewardship – Gary Kimble – Last year January was a higher income month than February, this year Feb was the higher month. Expenses were less this month than last year's average monthly expenses. Nancy will create a detailed list of our funds for us; she is limited on characters in the current report. Dan suggested drawing down interest annually on the endowments that are growing, in areas that don't get used and reinvesting them in the funds we can draw on. Stewardship is working with our endowment committee; Dave Storms, Kevin Beck, Ned Brown and Pastor Nick are looking into this, with a goal of diversifying our income.

Nominating Committee – we still need a Deacon but all slots are filled currently. Nick will meet with Jan.

New Business- The Security Committee was discussed an option was presented for Curt Harig to work under the Church Administrator to set up policies rather than with Trustees. No vote was taken.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Cindy Preston at 8:48 pm. These minutes respectfully submitted by Cindy Preston Clerk of Session
